Eligibility Requirements

1. Applicant must be a *U.S. citizen* of African descent pursuing an undergraduate degree or technical training at an accredited technical college.
2. Applicant must be graduating from high school, continuing his/her educational training, or be attending a college or university in the United States in the fall following high school graduation.
3. Applicant must reside in the greater Puget Sound area including but not limited to Pierce County, Federal Way, Olympia, and Kitsap County.
4. Applicant must be registered at an educational institution on a full-time basis as defined by the institution.
5. Applicant must have a Cumulative Grade Point Average of 2.7 or higher.
6. Applications must be typed. Handwritten applications and/or incomplete applications will not be accepted and will disqualify the applicant. A *complete* application includes a completed application form, required essays, three letters of recommendation, a facial photo and transcript.

Application Requirements

1. The Application, three (3) letters of recommendation and Photo must be emailed to TacomaLinksScholarships@gmail.com by no later than midnight **January 19, 2020**.
Two of the three letters must be completed by a teacher, counselor or principal. Letters from parents or family members do not meet this requirement.
2. Applicant's first and last name should appear in the subject line of the email, e.g., **Ann Smith**.
3. At least two weeks before **January 19, 2020**, Applicant should request the school email a copy of his or her official transcript to TacomaLinksScholarships@gmail.com to ensure its arrival by **January 19, 2020**.
5. Writing Samples- Two writing samples are required; please place full name on each essay.
 - a. Write a **paragraph** of not more than 250 words on the topic: "Why this Scholarship is Important to Me"
 - b. Write an **essay** of not more than 1000 words on **one** of the following topics:
 - Is it Safe to be Young and Black in America? How have you been personally impacted by the shooting of unarmed Blacks in recent years?
Or
 - Can Peaceful Protests, Such as Taking a Knee, Affect True Change in America?
Or
 - What Advice Would you Give to Your Peers about Using Drugs?
Or
 - In Today's Political Climate, Why Should We Vote?Use your own words. If you conduct research, include a bibliography if appropriate. Type your writing sample in 12-point font, double spaced in Times New Roman or Ariel font.
6. Photograph: Applicant must provide a 3x5 or 4x6 frontal facial photograph, e.g. school photo. Please be sure your photograph is clear and appropriate for reproducing in the program booklet featuring scholarship recipients. Do not send a full body picture.
7. The scholarship committee may request Applicant interviews.
8. **It is the Applicant's responsibility to ensure all parts of your application are submitted by no later than January 19, 2020.**
